#### Content of the Forum

The Danube Governance Forum: Improving Governance Together in the Western Balkans and the Danube Region is the final event of the programme Capacity Building of the countries in the Western Balkans and the Republic of Moldova<sup>1</sup> (BACID), funded by the Austrian Development Agency and implemented by the Austrian Association of Cities and Towns and KDZ-Centre for Public Administration Research.

At this occasion we would like to gather stakeholders with whom we have been cooperating in the past years to discuss the topics identified as priorities in improving governance of the countries in the Region on the way to the European Union, while promoting the cooperation of the public sector – national and local institutions – with civil society, science and the business sector. Besides ministries, local governments, NGOs and other organisations from the Western Balkans, the event will bring together our partner public institutions and private organisations from the whole Danube Region, as well as representatives of the EU and international organisations that are supporting European integration and public administration reforms in the Western Balkans and the Republic of Moldova.

Our partners are invited to present their challenges and achievements and discuss possible solutions to be further developed through future Danube Governance Hub activities.

Thus the Forum will focus on:

improving the capacity of public administration within the Danube Governance Hub
enabling local governments to fulfil EU-standards and deliver better services

During the three years of the BACID implementation we have been contributing to these goals through hands-on support to the partners from the Region and know-how exchange, while making synergies with other actions. As a result, we have developed a database of governance tools used in the Region in public administration reforms to be further assessed, revised and harmonized under the Danube Governance Hub. On the other side, we have elaborated a series of guidelines and publications in order to support local governments during their preparations for EU accession, among which the publication "The Future of Europe – Built on Strong Municipalities: Impact of the European Union on Local Authorities" gathers experiences of Austrian and local governments from the Region in the field of municipal finances, municipal services, EU integration and use of EU funds.

The existing materials and collected experiences shall serve as basis for the Forum discussions that will take place in the setting of open dialogues with all stakeholders aimed at giving directions to further Danube Governance Hub activities.

# **Target group**

The Forum is primarily targeting civil servants, representatives of public institutions and local governments from the Western Balkans and Moldova, civil society organisations, local government associations, regional networks such as ReSPA and NALAS, Austrian organisations, as well as businesses and science sector.

# **Objectives and results**

The objective of the Forum is to agree on the priorities in improving governance of the countries in the Region on their way to the European Union, while promoting the cooperation of the public sector – national and local institutions – with civil society, science and the business sector.

The expected results of the Forum are prioritized success factors and determined common next steps in modernisation of public administration in the Region.

# Methodology

# ☐ Open dialogue with round tables

The Forum is divided into two consecutive sessions, with parallel discussions around four tables at each session. The topics to be discussed are identified as the most important by the beneficiaries of the implemented BACID activities.

Each table has moderator and several panellists, with other participants around the table joining the discussion. The panellists will be invited to share their thoughts on two main questions in order to identify necessary factors for achieving success in the field and further steps that could be assisted through the Danube Governance Hub. The interventions of panellists will serve as basis for further exchange of experiences and discussion among participants.

The results of the discussion will be put by the moderators on pin-boards, to be further assessed by all participants.

#### ☐ Summing up of the results and prioritization

After the table discussions, the participants will be invited to make a round and prioritize the content presented on the pin-boards. The final results will be presented at plenary and addressed through future activities of the Danube Governance Hub.

The participants have been encouraged to promote their projects and/or organisations via presentations, posters, printed materials, interactive presentations or other media at the market place in the foyer.

# **Background Information**

#### □ BACID programme

The **BACID programme** has been implemented in a period of three years (2015-2017), aiming at strengthening national, regional and local governance structures of the target countries and preparing them for a possible accession to the European Union. The activities were carried out in three pillars:

- 1) <u>BACID Fund</u>: Small-scale grant scheme for know-how exchange between Austrian and partners from the target countries.
- 2) <u>Governance Forum</u>: Supporting good governance in the Region through exchange events and mentoring to selected public administrations.
- 3) <u>LOGON Danube</u>: Supporting the implementation of the EU 2020 Strategy for South-East Europe through assistance to local governments.

#### □ Danube Governance Hub (DGH)

The Conference "Public Governance as the Foundation of European Integration" took place in June 2016 in Vienna, with participants of public administration ministers from the Region as well as high representatives of the European Commission, the Austrian Government and other international and regional organisations. Under the umbrella of the BACID programme this event was organised in partnership with the Austrian Foreign Ministry, the City of Vienna, the PAC 10 "Institutional Capacity" of the EU Danube Strategy, the Regional Cooperation Council (RCC), as well as the Regional School of Public Administration (ReSPA) and the Network of Associations of Local Authorities of South-East Europe (NALAS) (http://www.bacid.eu/Conference).

At this occasion the **Danube Governance Hub** (DGH) was initiated and supported by all stakeholders as an open networking platform accessible to all relevant committed partners from governments, international organisations, universities, NGOs and companies promoting the **Public Governance and Public Administration Reform (PAR) based on European values in the Danube Region**. The initiative was launched within the BACID programme by KDZ-Centre for Public Administration Research and the Austrian Association of Cities and Towns (AACT) together with the Priority Area 10 "Stepping up Institutional Capacity and Cooperation" of the EU Strategy for the Danube Region (EUSDR) hosted by the City of Vienna.

The vision of the DGH is a strong public sector with highly developed capacities based on European values, thus cooperating closely with business, science and the civil sector in order to ensure security and prosperity in the Danube Region including the Western Balkans (http://www.bacid.eu/Danube\_Governance\_Hub).

The Danube Governance Hub pursues the following objectives:

strengthening European values and instruments of public management
initiating a forum for exchange on public administration instruments and strategies
recognising the essential role of local governments
improving public sector organisations by implementing pilot projects
encouraging excellent leadership
opening government for civil society and transparency
profiting from evidence based management and policy making

The first Danube Governance Hub activities have been:

- ✓ Danube Governance Hub Forum: "Tools for Better Public Governance in the Western Balkans", organised in December 2016 in cooperation with the Council of Europe and ReSPA, with presence of institutions responsible for public administration reforms in the countries of the Region.
- ✓ Database of instruments on good governance used in the Danube region.
- ✓ Established partnerships with the European Commission, the Council of Europe, regional organisations that represent national and local governments in South-East Europe (RCC, ReSPA, NALAS), Austrian stakeholders active in the Region and NGO networks.
